We kickstarted the NUSS' 70th-Anniversary celebrations by supporting our alma mater in the Plant-It-Forward Challenge, where trees were planted on the NUS campus in recognition of NUSS members' donations to the NUSS 70th Anniversary Bursary.

NUSS' legacy as a premier graduate club has been cemented by its enduring ties with its alma mater that trace back to the founding of the Society in 1954. NUSS plays a crucial role in facilitating scholarships, mentorship programmes and networking opportunities for NUS graduates. For instance, the NUSS-NUS Mentorship Programme that connects NUS

students with industry veterans has entered its 11th year and now features a total of 134 mentors, including 22 associate mentors, all paired with 210 enthusiastic mentees!

A Giving Year for NUSS

Key philanthropy initiatives.



The Society engaged in various initiatives in support of the Children's Wishing Well.

USS kicked off its 70th anniversary celebrations with an event organised in support of the NUS Plant-It-Forward Challenge, where a tree is planted on campus for every S\$1,000 donated to the cause. The funds raised went into the NUS Enhanced Financial Aid Scheme (EFAS) which ensures that all students, regardless of their financial circumstances, have access to education, while the trees planted contribute to the University's sustainability efforts. The Society strives to achieve a fundraising target of S\$70,000, earmarked for the planting of 70 trees.

Throughout the year, the Society supported impactful initiatives including our annual pledge of \$\$250,000 towards the NUS Alumni Bursary Fund. This has

been instrumental in supporting numerous financially challenged NUS students, such as the aspiring musicians at the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music.

Embracing innovation, NUSS backed the Philip Yeo Initiative for startup seed funding. The Society's commitment to sustainable development continued through the Bursary (Endowed) Fund for civil and environmental engineering. Furthering its dedication to leadership development, NUSS continued supporting the NUS College Alumni-NUSS Bursary, bridging the gap between alumni and current students.

The NUSS Community Care Sub-Committee remained actively engaged throughout the year in support of Dover Park Hospice and the Children's Wishing Well (CWW), two of NUSS' adopted charities. The year started with NUSS volunteers spending a meaningful day in January decorating the Dover Park Hospice festive corner for Chinese New Year. Noteworthy events in support of the CWW included a day out at the Kent Ridge Guild House in March, and in September, a grocery shopping trip and a visit to the Lee Kong Chian Natural History Museum as part of the NUS Day of Service initiative. In December, the Society supported the Backto-School Project, and within just a month, raised an astounding \$10,000, providing essential school supplies for 200 primary school children through the CWW initiative.

This year has been marked by meaningful contributions, reflecting the Society's ongoing commitment to create a brighter future for Singapore and the community.

The Society held its first in-person meeting after three years of having it online

he NUSS Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held at the Della & Seng Gee Guild Hall at Kent Ridge Guild House on 27 April 2023, making it the first-time members have gathered in person since social distancing restrictions forced the meeting online. About 150 NUSS members were present.

The meeting confirmed the minutes
of the AGM held virtually last year

on the Admirled virtually last year on 28 April 2022 and appointed an auditor for the coming year. Other topics discussed included the S\$2 million deficit reflected in the Financial Statements; the Mandalay Guild House lease, which is expiring in 2024; having more activities for seniors and targeting younger graduates; and the feasibility of a covered walkway from the carpark to the Kent Ridge Guild House.

The AGM closed on a high note, with members expressing their delight in attending the first physical meeting in three years.
